Part of school life outside of arts and crafts classes too!

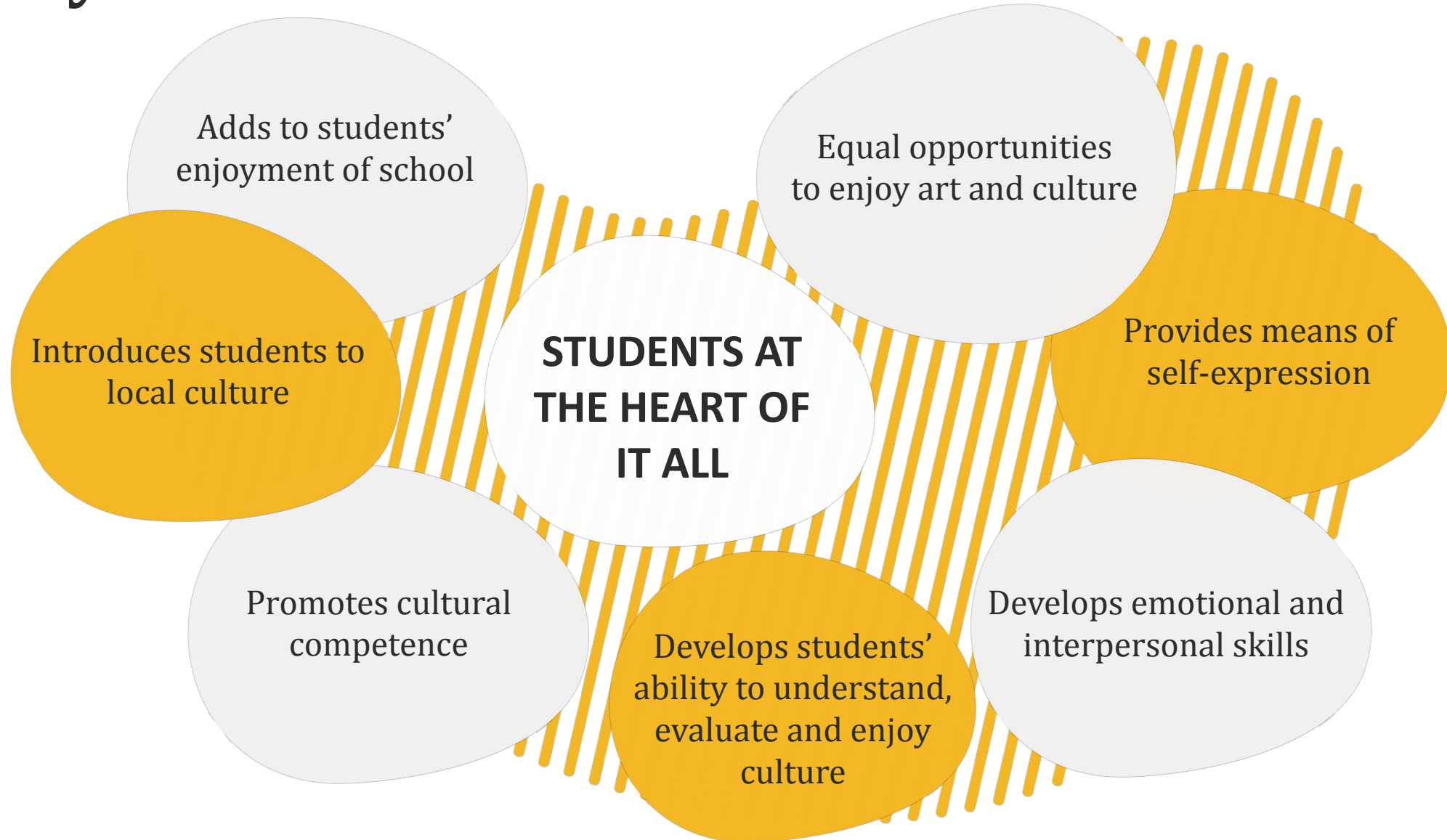
A shared tool for schools and partners in the arts and culture sector

Connects the municipality's own cultural activities with the goals of the local curriculum

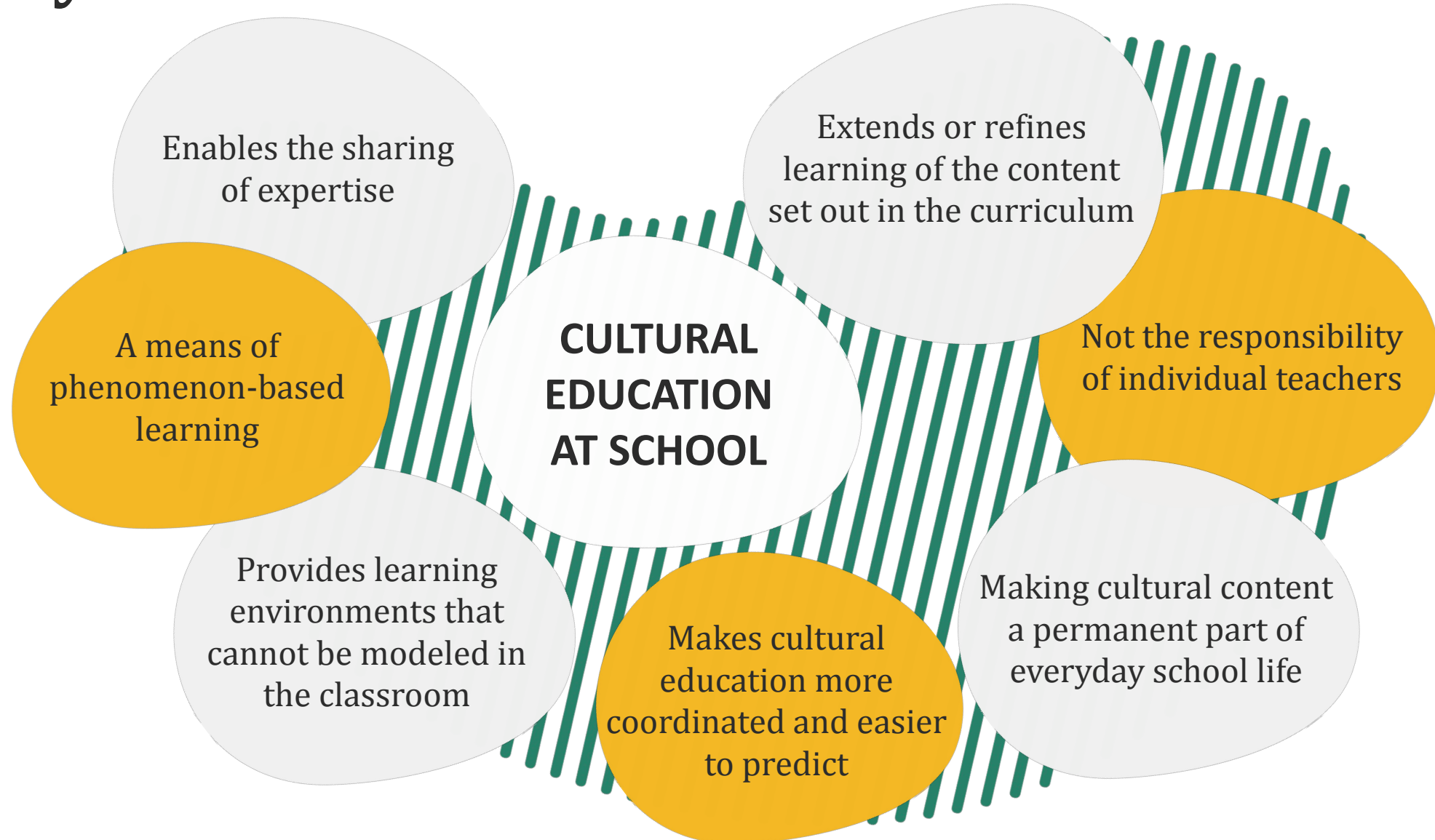
The plan can be municipal or regional

Variously known as a cultural education plan, cultural trail, cultural stairway or cultural route

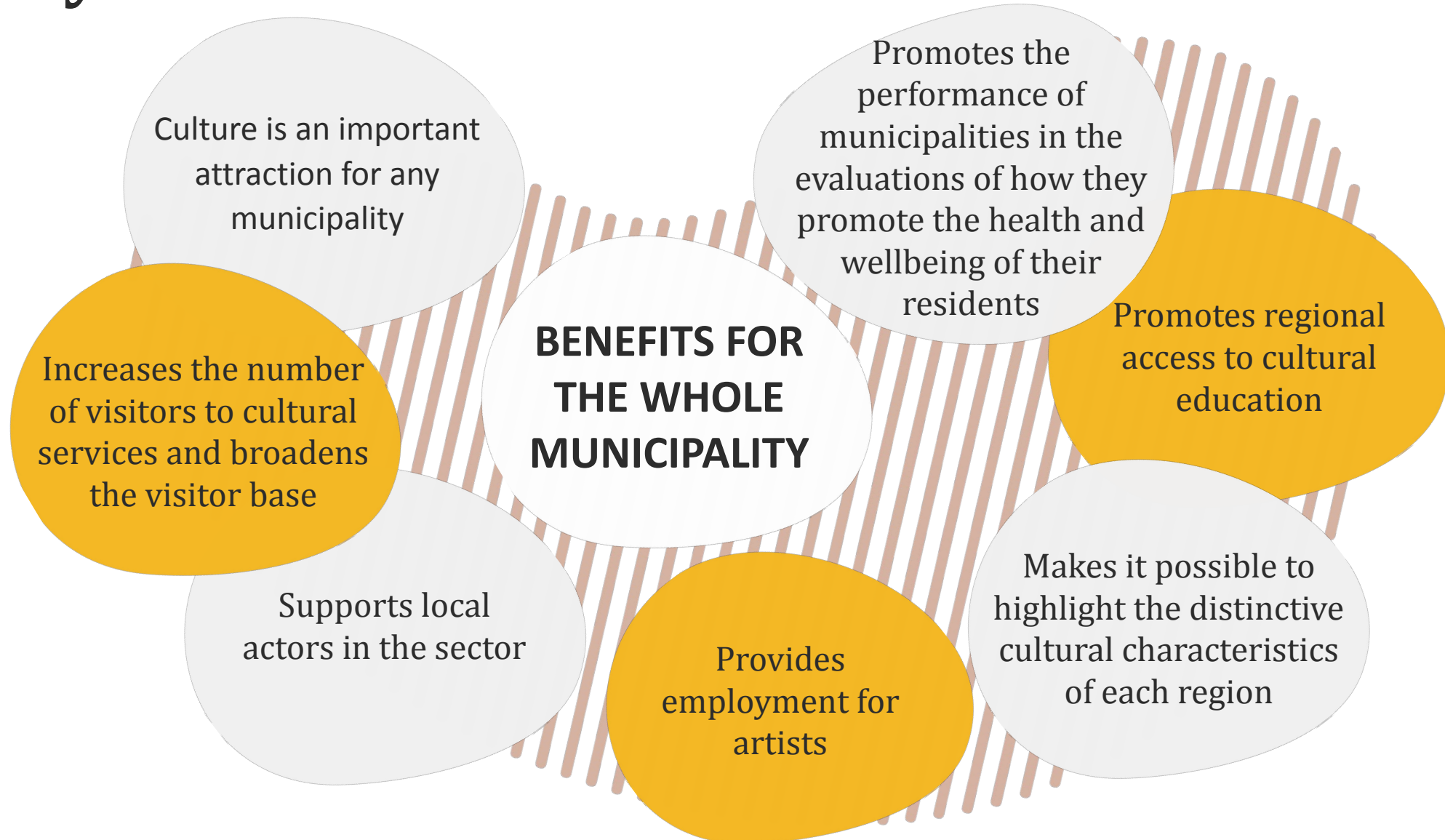



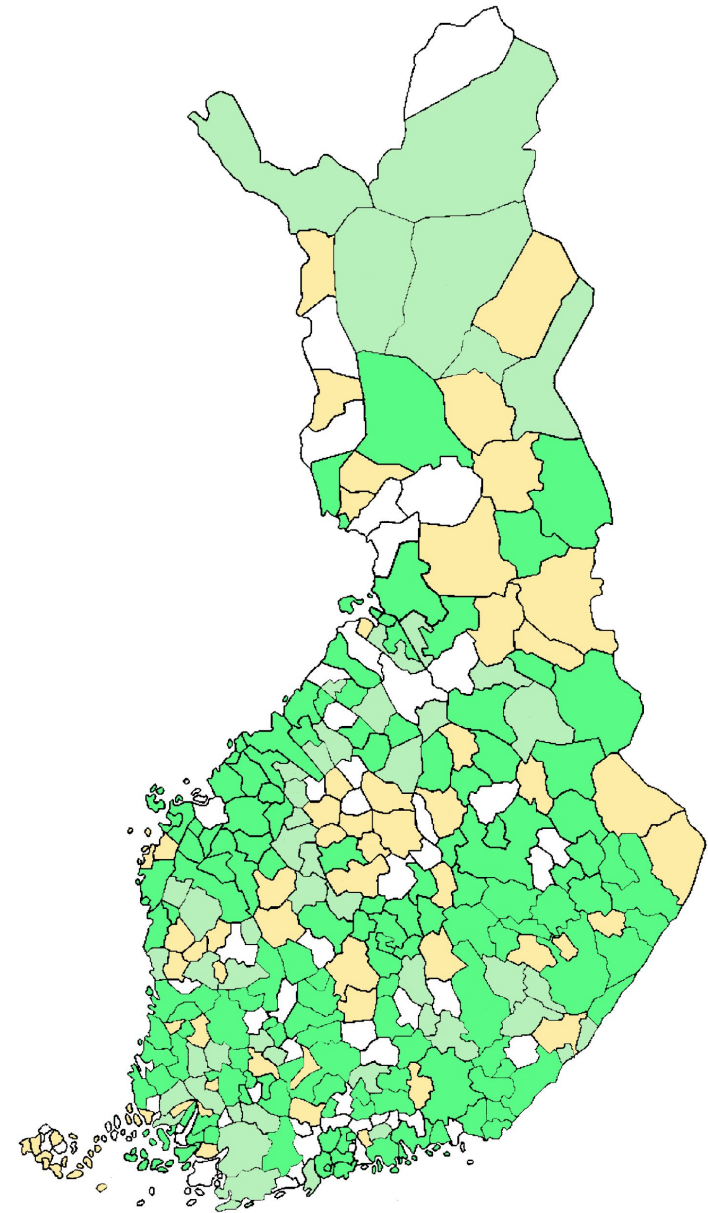
